JCCV Strategic Pillars

LEAD

Engaging political and key stakeholders to advance community interests through evidence-based research and advocacy.

COORDINATE

Mobilising collaborations between Jewish organisations and volunteers to meet the evolving needs of Victoria's Jewish community.

Actively listening to the community to uncover key needs and perspectives, broker connections and define common goals.

UPSKILL

Engaging service providers to foster understanding of Jewish life, history, and antisemitism and build intercultural connections.

JCCV's work: LEAD

- Trusted advisor in the development of new anti-vilification laws for Victoria.
- Key partner in the Department of Education's Combatting Antisemitism Consultative Group
- Regular meetings with the Premier, Opposition Leader and senior Shadow Ministers.
- Work with 18 local councils.
- Secured additional police resources for the Jewish community.

JCCV's work: COORDINATE

- JCCV community forums with:
 - Member organisations
 - Jewish community members
 - Key external stakeholders
- Community interfaith efforts during a challenging time.
- Media response, including after Adass Israel firebombing.



JCCV's work: ENGAGE

- Weekly updates to the community.
- Case management for community members who have been victims of antisemitism at schools and workplace
- Partner with and support member organisations in their endeavours.
- Educate non-Jewish groups about the Jewish community.
- Support to AUJS leaders during the encampments.



JCCV's work: UPSKILL

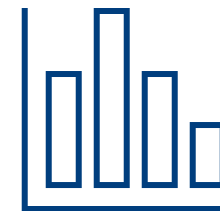
- Jewish Immersion Program – Jewish cultural familiarisation workshop for non-Jewish Victorians.

- Participating organisations include Officeworks, City of Glen Eira, Bentleigh Secondary College, Melbourne City Council, Commission for Children and Young People, and many more.



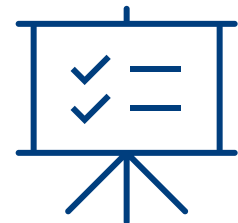
